Picture Books

13 Words by Lemony Snicket (2010)

Starting with "bird" and finishing with "mezzo-soprano," Lemony Snicket constructs a tale likely to intrigue not just young readers but also anyone who loves words.

A Bedtime for Bear by Bonnie Becker (2010)

Bear and Mouse, the pair from the very popular *A Visitor for Bear*, are back in this sleepover story. Bear wants absolute quiet as he falls asleep, but Mouse keeps disturbing him. When a few nighttime noises trouble Bear, though, he is glad to have his friend Mouse right there.

Bink and Gollie by Kate DiCamillo (2010)

Meet two precocious little girls — one tiny, one tall, and both utterly irrepressible. Setting out from their super-deluxe tree house and powered by plenty of peanut butter and pancakes, they share three comical adventures.

Chicken Big by Keith Graves (2010)

This big twist on the classic *Chicken Little* story lends a whole new perspective to what it means to be a chicken.

How Rocket Learned to Read by Tad Hills (2010)

Rocket the dog learns to read thanks to his teacher, a little yellow bird, and dedication to the craft of reading.

Once Upon a Baby Brother by Sarah Sullivan (2010)

Lizzie loves to make up stories and tell them to anyone who will listen. But when baby brother Marvin joins the family no one has time to listen. She's full of stories until the day her brother goes away on a trip and Lizzie runs out of ideas!

Rain School by James Rumford (2010)

In this story, set in Chad, the first thing the students must do as the school year begins is build the mud structure that will serve as their classroom for the next nine months. Older and younger brothers and sisters work together and learn together. At the end of the school year, the rains wash away the school they have built, but not the knowledge they have gained.

Rhyming Dust Bunnies and Here comes the Big, Mean Dust Bunny! by Jan Thomas (2009)

Silly rhyming books that will keep you laughing until the end of the book.

Shrek by William Steig (1990)

Most children are unaware of the book version. It will spark a conversation about the differences in the movie.
